## Do you have an ORCID profile not very well populated and a well filled out HAL account?

Connecting them will help you avoid duplication, save time, and increase the visibility of your work.

### ORCID is a central identifier in the research ecosystem.

It is used — or even required — by many stakeholders and facilitates the circulation and reuse of references across the entire scientific landscape.

## Why add your ORCID?

**Benefit from unique and reliable identification**, especially in the case of homonyms.

**Save time** by sending your HAL references to your ORCID profile with a single click, avoiding double entries.

**Boost the visibility of your work** with an essential researcher identifier that is widely adopted by publishers, funding agencies, and platforms for disseminating scientific work (such as publications, datasets, and software).

## One link, more impact



- Improves the identification and attribution of bibliographic references.
- Optimises data suggestions.
- Enables data extraction.
- Displays datasets in the CV.

Synchronisation

Linking your HAL profile to ORCID means that it becomes fully integrated into this interconnected environment. This makes your repositories more visible and better connected to other platforms, as well as making them more easily accessible to the organisations that rely on ORCID.

## A must-have...

**60%** of researchers worldwide have an active ORCID identifier (Haak, 2020).

It is **the most widely used international identifier across all disciplines**, ahead of Google Scholar and ResearchGate (Haak, 2020).

## ... in the academic world

Increasingly required by **publishers and funding agencies**, the ORCID identifier **simplifies repositories and editorial processes**, while ensuring **better visibility and attribution of your work** (Meadows, 2016).

## Good practices

**Update** your ORCID file from HAL regularly with just a few clicks.

**Add your ORCID** and all your other identifiers (Arxiv, IdRef, etc.) to your HAL profile.

**Activate the display** of your identifiers on your HAL CV to maximise the visibility of your work.
